Introduction

The following is the beginning of a quest to learn and document the history of the Nale family of Mifflin County, Pennsylvania. The quest was begun in about 1995 when I began to gather together all the information that I had on my Nale ancestors. Some of this was passed on to me by my father, Harry E. Nale, along with some of my grandfather's possessions – mostly related to his military career.

I have had several searches for Nale material done at the Mifflin County Historical Society at Lewistown, Pa. Ms. Marian Barr, a research volunteer at the society, has come up with much of the information that follows. She had been very thorough in her research. I have been also able to make some contacts with members of the Nale family in Mifflin County and elsewhere who have supplied information on their branches of the Nale tree. Kathy Waters, of Juliustown, N.J., is descended from the family of Sarah Weidman and has been most helpful with information about that line and about the Nales. Dr. Jeff and Debbie Nale of Mifflintown have provided much information about the family of John Reed Nale and the photo of William H. Nale. Charles Lee Nale has provided information about the Charles Lunger Nale family. Gerri Atikin supplied many of the Mifflin County obituaries. Willard Shank of Mifflin County has contributed records from the Siglerville Lutheran Church and the Salem Cemetery.

However much we know at present, there is still a lot to be learned. We know very little about William and Sarah Nale beyond what is in Albert W. Nale's obituary. It is hoped that someday some more pictures will show up along with other information. At this point we have a photo of William Nale and one of the gravestone – courtesy of Kathy Waters. We know some things about some of their children and practically nothing about some of the others. What we do know is included. The format of this study will be arranged so that it can be easily revised, corrected and added to. We would like to know, among many other things, the name of the Amish family that raised William Nale and whether he had any brothers and sisters. After the section of William H. Nale is some information on a possible link between the research of Roger Nale and his father and the W. H. Nale family.

Copies of this study will be distributed to members of the Nale family and to anyone who requests them. Copies will be sent to the Mifflin Country Historical Society and the Genealogical Society of Blair County to be made available to anyone who inquires about the Nales. It is hoped that those who may benefit from this research will also share what they know with the Societies and with other Nales.

The origins of the Nale name are many and most of them obscure. We know that there were Nales of English and Scottish origin. The name also appears in some French and Italian families. My father claimed that his family was of Welsh origin, however there is also the assertion in the Stanley Nale notes that William H. Nale was German and Irish. Many of the Nales who have contacted me were of German origin. The name would derive from the German nagel, which means nail or peg. Some Nagels anglicized the name as Nagle, others dropped the "g" and became Nales. We cannot know for sure until we can get to William's parents. If the Roger Nale material links to ours then the origin of our name is definitely German

This is a copy of a copy of a photo sent to me by Jeff and Debbie Nale of Mifflintown, Pa. Written below the photo was "Billie Nale, father of John Reed Nale." No idea of when or where it was taken. We had hoped to have a photo of Sarah Nale but to this point none has appeared.

William H. and Sarah Weidman Nale

The only solid information we have about William H. Nale appears in the obituary of his son Albert W. in the *Lewistown Sentinel* of June 20, 1932, as follows:

"Albert Weidman Nale was born October 10, 1844, at Belleville, the son of William H. and Sarah Weidman Nale. His father's parents died when the former was rather young and he was raised by the Amish people and in early manhood took over a farm for himself near Belleville where the present Mr. Nale was born. Mr. Nale was 8 years of age when his parents moved to what was known as the Rhoda Taylor farm below Milroy where his father farmed for a period of some 22 years."

One of the only references that I have is a sentence from, *History of the Susquehanna and Juniata Valleys: Mifflin, Juniata, Perry, Union and Snyder Counties*; Everts, Peck & Richards, Philadelphia, 1886: "William Nale was elected an active elder May 16, 1866 in the Lutheran Church of Siglerville." We know that William and Sarah were members of the Siglerville church and Willard Shank has provided records of their communing there and of the baptisms of some of their children.

There is this notice in the *Lewistown Gazette* of May 10, 1871 under "Died" - "On the 5th of April 1871, in Armagh township, after weeks of painful suffering, Wm Nail, in the 52nd year of his age, leaving a large family to deplore his loss."

We know that William and Sarah Nale are buried in the Old Salem Lutheran Cemetery between Milroy and Siglerville. A photo of the gravestone follows – courtesy of Kathy Waters. Their dates of birth and death are given as: William – born 1820 and died April 5, 1871 in Armagh Township; Sarah – born September 1826 and died April 20, 1906. Sarah's date of death is given as April 20, 1906 in a list of obituaries from the MCHS - her age: 78-9-16. Copies of court papers received from Charles Lee Nale, Sr., a descendant of Charles Lunger Nale indicate that William H. Nale died intestate and in debt. Henry L. Close was named the administrator of his estate. On August 26, 1872, a petition to sell the property was filed by Mr. Close. William H. Nale had owned two tracts of land in Potter Twp., Centre County, one containing 150 acres, 58 perches and allowances. The other was a 10 acre tract of woodland. There is also a petition to appoint a guardian for the minor children of Wm. and Sarah, Ella and C, .Lunger being older than fourteen, and S. Jennie and William M. being under fourteen. Jesse W. Horton was appointed their guardian on March 7, 1878. Copies of some of these documents follow.

The spelling of the last name alternates between Nale and Nail in these early records and reports, including the Census returns. The evidence indicates that the family used the Nale spelling.

I have received from Jeff and Debbie Nale a page of handwritten notes concerning the family. They were written by Stanley Nale some time before his death. Most of what is here has checked out to be accurate. They are as follows:

"Born between 1815 and 1830 (a guess) Billie Nale. Great grandfather. Orphan - raised by Amish in Big Valley. Lived around Siglerville all his life. His wife was a Weidman from the East end. A farmer and blacksmith. He had no brothers or sisters as far as we know. He was half Irish and half German. His parents died when he was a boy. He died when he was aged 57 of a carbuncle on his neck. Grandmother Weidman lived longer - remembered by Uncle Bill and she spoke German."

Also in these notes:
"Uncle Billie drafted - pay (\$)250 but uncle Al went in his place and in lieu of the 250" Of Al(bert) it is noted "in Politics, a court crier."

This last is especially interesting. Albert had served for a month in the 36th Pa. Militia in August, 1863. The draft was so arranged in those times that one could be deferred for the payment of a certain sum or if one could supply a substitute. So Albert went in his father's place and was assigned to the 205th Pa. Volunteer Infantry. I have compiled histories of the 36th and 205th and they may be included in the volume on Albert.

The notes also include these comments about William's children:
"Albert. Oldest. Now in Siglerville. Oldest, lived to 90. Harry, one sister, Perry, Clarence, Frank, Jess (and one name that I cannot make out). Had a big family. Harry - Navy man. Ellie Rothrock - married name
Uncle Jack - died in Siglerville. Son Clarence & Earl (Cop in Wash.) & Gilbert.
Uncle Mac - no kids.
Some girls - one died at 12 (Jennie?)
Aunt Cal - married Ed Close. lived? at Uncle Walt's? place.
Aunt Mary Ramsey
Another married to Uncle Adam Ramsey
Uncle Life? (Eliphas?) died in Siglerville. Wife died when Tom was three days. Raised by Rachel and John Reed. (a line goes from Tom to what looks like the names of three of his children: Foss, Ernie and Brown A line then goes from Ernie to two names that are difficult to make out, One is Col---. The other looks like Nazia or Nagia Foles or Fales and the word 'died')"

Died intestate – CL Nale papers.

There are many questions remaining about William H. Nale. What does the H. stand for – I would guess Henry or Harry? What was the name of the Amish family who raised him? Is there any record of his parents? It is hoped that someone will someday come up with some answers.

Following is a summary of what I have learned about Sarah's family, the Weidmans, for which we have records that go back to Sarah's parents. This information comes from Kathy Waters. Then a summary of what I know at present about the children of William and Sarah other than Albert, who will be discussed in a later section and finally, copies of the U.S. Census returns relevant to the families plus any other records that I was able to obtain and copy.

I mention here one of many mysteries remaining: the 1860 Census lists a John A. Nale, age 27, occupation, miller. His wife is Amelia E., age 21 and there is a daughter, Mary E, age 3. They resided in Armagh Township. The Everts, Peck & Richards history has this note on page 309: "Co. F, Mifflin Co., 107th Reg. John A. Nale, private, mustered in March 8, 1862, 3 yrs. Died of wounds received at Antietam, Md. Sept. 17, 1862; buried in Military Asylum Cemetery, D.C." I have sent for and have a copy of his service records – which confirm the information above. I have not been able to find any relationship of John A. to the rest of the Nale family. He would have been 12 years younger than William H. and may have been a younger brother – or they may not have been related. There are hints that John A. could have come to the valley from Maryland. Amelia was remarried to Joseph Shreffler, both listed as from Lewistown, on April 2, 1868.

Another unconnected piece of the puzzle is the mention of a Henry H. Nail in the 1860 Census, age 18, living as a laborer with the John and Mary McNitt family of Armagh Township. On page 202 of Everts etc. this appears: "Co. C, 44th Reg., Henry H. Nale, private, must. in August 10, 1862, 3 years, transferred to Co. D, battalion, September 9, 1864, promoted to Corp. Co. A. veteran. The 44th Regiment was the First Pa. Cavalry Regiment and served from the summer of 1861 to September of 1864. Henry H. Nale's name appears in the Roster of Company C of the 1st Cavalry in Bates, *History of Pennsylvania Volunteers* - Mustered in

August 10, 1861. "Transferred to Co. D, battalion, September 9, 1864 – pr. to Corporal, Co. A – Vet."

There is also a Susanna Nail noted in the 1850 Census, age 40, and living with the David Moist family of Granville Twp., Mifflin County.

A possible link to William H. Nale's parents

The following is a portion of some correspondence I have had with Roger Nale of the Annapolis, MD area. He and his father have done extensive research on the early Nail/Nale lines back to a Philip Daniel Nagel. He has two Nail/Nales who were in the right area and of the age to have a son born around 1820. William H. and Albert W. Nale are both mentioned in the research. It is hoped that someone in the Mifflin County area will be able to come with the link - with information about the Frederick and/or John Nales who could have been William H. Nale's father.

The Roger Nale information follows:

I have two Nail's who migrated to Huntingdon Co., around 1810. Frederick Nail had a son William born about 1808 but I know nothing more about him. The most perplexing thing about the Nail line I'm researching is that between 1840 and 1860 many of the individuals changed the spelling to Nale. This occurred in nearly all of the lines! My GGGrandfather was John S. Nail, but two of his seven sons changed the spelling to Nale.

There are many Nail's and Nale's living in Blair and Huntingdon counties who are descended from Henry (my line), Frederick, and Christopher Nail. Their father was Philip Daniel Nagel and his name is spelled as Nagel, Nagle, Nail, Naille, Nails, Naile and Nale in census records, church records, wills, deeds, and chancery court records from 1784 thru 1804. I am also aware of other Nail and Nale lines in Pennsylvania which originated in England and Ireland. However, the vast majority of Nail/Nale's who resided in the area were from Philip Daniel's children. Most of the other Nail/Nale's moved west in the 1820's.

Ever hear of Riggles Gap, PA? It's very close to Belleville. That is where my direct ancestor, Henry Nail, settled between 1810 and 1815. I am including a 4 generation descendant chart for Henry's brother Frederick because he migrated from MD to Huntingdon Co., PA around 1810 and he has a son Frederick born about 1796 and I have nothing on him yet. This line from Frederick through his son John is where Lemuel and C. L. (Carl Lester) Nale/Nail come in. Lemuel was the son of David Engard Nail who was a 205th PA veteran.

There is another line from Christopher Nail, brother of Henry and Frederick, who also migrated to Huntingdon, PA around 1810. Christopher had a son John who was born between 1790 and 1800 and I have nothing on him either.

I think that if there is a link it is either Frederick's son Frederick or Christopher's son John. Their birth dates would be right for them to have a child born around 1820. I hope to be able to get to Harrisburg to do some research in the near future to try to find out something on Frederick and John.

While looking for information on Christopher Nail's line I came across extensive work my father did which includes your Albert W. Nale. He has William H. and Sarah with William being a possible grandson of Christopher!

The link is weak because it is through Christopher's son John. I don't have any documentation yet but the suspicion is strong. John was born between 1790 and 1800 with the date closer to 1790 being most likely. Do you know of anyone in Mifflin Co. who could pursue this possibility?

I had put the William H. line aside because I'm not able to get up to PA to do extensive research right now. I'm going to add his line to my database as an unrelated individual and hope to make the connection later. The picture my grandmother had leads me to believe that we are indeed related.

Since you lived in PA you might make more sense than I can out of the splitting of Huntingdon Co. into other

counties. I know that Antis Twp. went to Blair Co. and that is where the Henry Nail I am descended from settled. Henry is in Antis Twp. of Huntingdon Co. on the 1820 and 1830 census. His brother Christopher is in Henderson Twp. in 1820 and brother Frederick is in Union Twp. in 1810 and Porter Twp. In 1820. Both Frederick and Christopher died between 1820 and 1830 so I have had to trace their children on later census records. Henry lived until 1862 and he is shown from 1820 to 1860 in Antis Township.

On the 1830 census for Huntingdon Co. there is Daniel Nail (probably son of Christopher) in Union Twp., John Nale (also probably son of Christopher although Frederick had a son John as well) in Rolandburg Twp., Peter Nail (son of Christopher, also on 1840) in Petersburg Twp., Betsy Nail (Elizabeth the widow of Frederick, also on 1840 and 1850) in Huntingdon Borough, and James M. Nail (no relation that I can find) in Tell Township. I have no idea which of these townships may have been split or became part of Mifflin Co. when it was formed. There is a Union Twp. in both Huntingdon and Mifflin counties today.

Aside from Christopher's son John (b. about 1800) and Frederick's son Frederick (b. about 1796), I have family information on all of Henry, Frederick, and Christopher's sons. Thus, if there is a connection it would be from either John or Frederick.

The Weidman Family

First, Sarah Weidman Nale's parents. Much of this information was supplied by Kathy Waters of Juliustown, N.J. who has traced her family tree to Sarah's parents.

Jacob Weidman, born November 4, 1794, and his wife, Barbara Roop Weidman moved to a farm near Belleville, Mifflin Co. Pa. in 1825 from Dauphin County. Jacob died in 1836, leaving Barbara with several small children. Barbara never remarried and lived to be 82 years old, dying at Belleville on June 9, 1882. Her birth year is 1799. Two children, Johnny and Franny preceded Jacob in death.

According to Barbara's obituary, she was buried in the "Omish" cemetery along with her husband and two children. It is stated that Jacob died at the time the Lutheran Church was being built at Mechanicsville and was buried with the Amish and "her children were buried in the 'Omish' cemetery before there was one laid out for the Lutherans." The children were obviously Johnny and Franny.

Of the surviving children, Sarah was born in 1826, Martha in 1832, Leah on January 24, 1818, and Adam Roop on November 25, 1835.

Sarah married William H. Nale. She died in 1906. This line is traced in the Nale files.

Martha married Dr. William G. Bigelow, b. 1824. She died late in the 1860's - probably at or soon after the birth of Elmina. Their children and birth dates: Sara E., 1851; Lebbeus E. 1853; Jacob W., 1855; David R., 1858; Laura E., 1862; Adam A., 1865. Elmina J., 1869.

Leah was born on January 24, 1818 in Dauphin County and died on June 13, 1902. She married Dr. Eliphaz Bigelow - born October 20, 1807 in Plain City Ohio - died October 23, 1868 in Huntingdon Co. Pa. Their children: Jacob W., 1848; Brown A., 1850; Francesca Almira, 1856; Barbara. When the Dr. died in 1863, William H. Nale was named the guardian of the children, Brown A. and Francesca, in the settlement of the estate.

Adam Roop Weidman was born on November 25, 1835 at Belleville and died on August 5, 1919. He married Amanda Catherine Cole on February 21, 1858. In the obituaries for Adam R. Weidman, Albert Nale is listed as a life-long friend. They were both in the Civil War and spent their lives in the Belleville-Milroy areas. Adam was a blacksmith. Adam served in Co. D, 131st Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry. Was a member of Lt. Gilbert Beaver Post #296 of the GAR. and a member of the Lutheran Church of Belleville. He served for many years as the village and township constable.

Adam and Amanda's children: William Eliphas, John Henry, Grandville G, Jesse Horton; Barbara, Leah, Sara, Laura, Margaret Ellen, Mary Catherine. William E. married Mary M. Ramsey and moved to Burlington, NJ - he was a blacksmith. John Henry, a watchmaker went east. Grandville and Jesse went to Ohio, one a farmer the other to work on the railroad. Barbara and Leah died in childhood. Sara married Henry Lytle. Laura and Margaret married Henry and Edmond Bennett. Mary C. married James Pennepacker. Bennetts and Pennepackers are still in the Belleville area.

Following are the obituaries of Barbara Roop Weidman and her son Adam.

Barbara Roop Weidman – *Lewistown Gazette* – 6/14/1882

Died at the residence of her son, Adam Weidman, in Belleville, on Friday, June 9, 1882, Mrs. Barbara Weidman, age 82 years, 9 months and 5 days. Mrs. Weidman was born in Dauphin County in 1799, her maiden name having been Barbara Roop. She came to Union Township in 1825, and has resided here ever since. Her husband, Jacob Weidman, died in 1836, leaving her with four small children, Adam being then only about one year old. She courageously struggled through life, raised her family respectably, taught them all industry and economy and lived to see them well situated in life and surrounded with large and interesting families. Three of her children are living, two having died previous to her husband and Mrs. Wm. G. Bigelow died about the close of the war. She had thirty-four grandchildren and forty great-grandchildren, all of whom except ten reside in Mifflin County and all in this state. There were present at her funeral 3 children, 20 grandchildren and 9 great-grandchildren and a large number of her old friends and neighbors. She was buried in the Omish graveyard where her two children and her husband had previously been interred. She was a consistent and devoted member of the Lutheran Church for many years and was among the earliest members at this place. Her husband died at the time the Lutheran Church was built at Mechanicsville, and her children were buried in the Omish graveyard before there was one laid out for the Lutherans. She was always zealous in good work and trained up her children in the same faith that she professed. She was one of very few old persons who could devoutly say that she had never wronged any human being intentionally. An analysis of her character reveals to us many things worthy of our emulation, as she was a kind and affectionate mother, a faithful and devoted nurse and many are the sleepless hours she spent in alleviating the sufferings of the distressed, and many remember her today with great gratitude. For a number of years grandmother Weidman made her home among her children and grandchildren, always being kindly welcome wherever she went. Until recently she was very active and was constantly busy at some light work. She came to her son's about two months ago, and then told Mrs. W. she had come home to die. Rev. J. M. Steck preached an impressive sermon on the occasion.

Adam Roop Weidman – *Lewistown Gazette*? – August 14, 1919.

It is with a feeling of profound (honor?) that the writer is called upon to chronicle the death of this good friend, neighbor and citizen, yet I am glad that it has been my privilege to have known and associated for so long a time with a man of the character and goodness of heart of Adam Weidman. Born November 25th, 1835, died August 5th, 1919 at the age of 83 years, 7 months and 10 days. Surely a good man has passed away. On February 21st, 1858 he was united in marriage with Catherine Cole, and for 63 years were they permitted to live happily together. The union was blessed by God with a family of ten children, seven of whom survive the father and were present at his funeral. 39 grandchildren, 58 great grandchildren and 2 great great grandchildren are the offspring of this marriage union.

The patriotic spirit and good citizenship of Adam Weidman was manifest throughout his entire life. On the 7th day of August, 186? He voluntarily entered the active service of his country when its destiny was a matter of momentary question, and leaving his wife and two children he placed his life upon freedom's altar and gloriously defended the flag throughout the Civil War, winning distinction and honor which followed him to the day of the close of his mortal life. In all things pertaining to the good and welfare of the community his services were sought and freely given. The children of the town were his friends, he had no enemies. Oh, what a record!

Not only was Adam Weidman a good soldier in civil life, but he was also a good soldier in spiritual things, a member of the Lutheran Church, steadfast in faith. He abhorred evil things and a careful study of his life would lead anyone to believe that his death was but a passing from a world of sin and sorrow to a world of joy and peace.

In civil life and for many years, Mr. Weidman was engaged in the Blacksmith trade and followed this vocation in Belleville where he had a large and appreciative line of customers. He

did good work, was honest in his dealings and very trustworthy. For at least 35 years he was the village constable, not by his own choosing, but by being the unanimous choice of the people, seldom if ever having any opposition, all political parties being willing to (?) him as a capable and efficient officer. In later years as the strength of the body began to fail and it was no longer possible for him to continue his trade as a blacksmith, he served the School Board as Janitor of the Public Schools and also as sexton of the Presbyterian Church. The school boys and girl as they entered their school building were greeted with a smile from the face of the old Janitor and who knows but that such a greeting served as an encouragement to many a boy and girl as they struggle to obtain the coveted education.

There are no words that I can use that will do justice to this noble man. I shall never forget him. I would not want to forget him. His life was an inspiration to us all and by his quiet (/) way was beloved by all who (?) him. (Next few words unreadable) ..me thinks that I can yet see the Old Captain lining up the boys of Company "A" for their drill in military tactics and how proud he was of them and they of him and as my imagination leads me onward and upward I can see my friend in that far better land greeting his comrades of Gilbert Beaver Post who preceded him to glory and in his preparation to greet those few remaining as they shall one by one be called up higher.

Beautiful and impressive services were held at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Harry Bennett and at the Lutheran Church conducted by Rev. Mr. Carver, pastor of the Methodist Church in the absence of Rev. Mr. Ross. Rev. C.S. Bottiger of Berwick a former pastor of deceased, being present assisted and thus was laid to rest the grand old man whose hoary head was blessed with a crown of righteousness.

His youth was innocent; his riper age
Marked with some act of goodness every day;
And watched by eyes that loved him, calm and sage,
Faded his late (?) years away.
Meekly he gave his being up and went
To share the holy rest that waits a life well spent

Belleville

Adam Weidman, Belleville's oldest male resident died Tuesday evening at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Harry Bennett. Had he lived until November 1st, he would have been 84 years old. "Cap" Weidman, as he was known to old and young was a life-long resident of Belleville. In early life he followed the occupation of blacksmith. At the outbreak of the Civil War he left and wife and four children, the baby but three months old, to serve his country. He belonged to Co. D, 131st Regiment, and saw a lot of hard service. He was a member of Lieutenant Gilbert Beaver Post 296 of Belleville whose members are fast answering the last roll call.

Probably no man in Belleville was more popular with the boys than Cap. He took a great interest in them, and for several years had companies of boys which he drilled in military tactics. The boys of the village have lost a splendid friend. He served as janitor of the school building for several winters and girls and boys were all his close associates.

Mr. and Mrs. Weidman journeyed life's pathway together for sixty-three years. His aged help-mate still survives, together with three sons and four daughters and grand children and great grandchildren. One son, Eliphas, died about a year ago. The surviving children are John of Bucks County; Jesse and Grant of Ohio; Sadie (Mrs. Lytle) of Altoona; Ella of New Jersey; Kate Laura (Mrs. Bennett) of Belleville.

In the passing of Adam Weidman Belleville loses one of its honored and upright citizens, and many will feel his death as a personal loss because of the ties of friendship which bound him to so many. He had a kind word and a jovial greeting for everyone. Truly he was a "friend to man." He was a member of the Lutheran Church in Belleville and will be buried in the cemetery in front of the church. Funeral services will be held at the church on Thursday afternoon at

1:30 conducted by Rev. W. A. Carver of the Methodist Church.

Same page – under "Milroy"

Adam Weidman, who died in Belleville this week was well known here, he being the father of Mrs. James Pennepacker of this town. He was also an army comrade and life long friend of Albert W. Nale of the Pennepacker family. Mr. Nale and Mr. and Mrs. Guy Lauver attended the funeral Thursday.

Albert W. Nale dies, Age 87

Prominent Civil War Veteran and County Office Holder of Milroy is Dead

Albert W. Nale, age 87 years, 8 months and 10 days, one of the two surviving members of the Gilbert Beaver Post of the G.A.R. of Belleville and for many years a prominent figure in the public life of Mifflin County, died this morning at Altoona, having suffered a stroke on Sunday. Mr. Nale had spent the past year in Mifflin County with his daughter, Mrs. B. A. Baker, at Milroy and two weeks ago had gone to Altoona to spend some time with sons residing there. Albert Weidman Nale was born October 10, 1844 at Belleville, the son of William H. and Sara Weidman Nale. His father's parents died when the former was rather young and he was raised by the Amish people and in early manhood took over a farm for himself near Belleville where the present Mr. Nale was born.

Mr. Nale was 8 years of age when his parents moved to what was known as the Rhoda Taylor

farm below Milroy where his father farmed for some 22 years. It was during the residence of the Nale family on this farm, at the age of 18 years he entered the Union Army and participated in some of the heavy fighting which occurred during the latter part of the conflict.

Mr. Nale's first enlistment was on June 29, 1863, for a period of three months, he having been assigned to Company H, 36th Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry. His regiment was sent to Camp Curtin at Harrisburg and there armed and uniformed and on July 3 they were sent to Gettysburg where the great decisive fight of the war was then being concluded.

The second enlistment for Mr. Nale came on August 20, 1864 and this was for one year or the duration of the war. He enlisted under Captain F. H. McClanahan of Milroy, and was assigned to the 205th regiment, Company K, under General Hartranft who was commander of the 3rd Division, 9th Corps, composed of all Pennsylvania troops.

After doing fatigue duty for a month Mr. Nale's company was sent to the front line, the veteran participating in quite a number of battles including the fight at Petersburg where he was struck by a "minnie" ball, the bullet cutting through the flesh on the upper side of the left arm and then struck Mr. Nale on the shoulder.

After being honorably discharged from the Federal service Mr. Nale came home and went farming. Shortly afterwards, on December 7, 1866, he was married to Sophia Ramsey of near Milroy who died in 1917. To this union nine boys and two girls were born, two of the boys being deceased while one of the girls died in infancy.

In the Spring of 1867, Mr. Nale and his wife moved to Centre County to the section known as the Loop and remained there for three years. Then they moved to a farm of Mrs. Nale's father, Perry Ramsey, three miles east of Milroy and stayed there until the Spring of 1876, when the family removed to Union Township, near Belleville, where Mr. Nale engaged in farming for over 20 years.

It was in 1896 that he bought a fruit farm near Milroy and remained there for nine years, going into Milroy in 1905 and remaining in his own home until the death of his wife 12 years later.

Then he made his home with his daughter, Mrs. B. A. Baker of Milroy, the past few years spending much time with his sons in Altoona.

In addition to following the pursuit of farming practically all of his life, Mr. Nale served as county commissioner in Mifflin County for two terms, each of three years, having been first elected in 1896. He also served as jury commissioner at other times a total of 14 years and then for 10 years was court crier, having been in the public service for a period of 30 years or better. Always a staunch Republican Mr. Nale cast his first vote for John W. Geary for governor of Pennsylvania. While he was not old enough to vote for Lincoln, he had the pleasure of shaking hands with him at Fort Stedman, in the Civil War days, on an occasion when Lincoln reviewed the troops at that place. Mr. Nale never missed a general election, in November, 1931, casting his 66th consecutive ballot.

A member of the Gilbert Beaver Post, No 296, G.A.R. at Belleville, Mr. Nale was active in the affairs of veterans. He was a member of the I. O. O. F., in which order he has held membership for over 40 years. He is a member also of the Lutheran Church at Milroy.

He is survived by six sons, all residents of Altoona, Harry E. Nale, Altoona traffic officer; John, Perry, Frank and Clarence Nale, all employed by the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, and Brown Nale, an employee of the Reed Tobacco Company. A son, Jesse, preceded him in death last August. Funeral arrangements have not yet been completed.

Forty-two grandchildren and 18 great grandchildren survive; also two brothers, John R. Nale of Milroy, and W. Mack Nale of Lewistown, and a sister, Mrs. Ella Rothrock of Lewistown.

Funeral Services

The body of Albert W. Nale, Civil War veteran, who died at the home of his son, Clarence Nale, Altoona, where he was guest, Monday morning, 7 o'clock, will be brought overland to Milroy, his home town, Wednesday forenoon. In the Milroy Lutheran Church, Wednesday afternoon, 2:30 o'clock, the funeral service will be conducted by the pastor of the deceased, Rev. Charles Ashton Lantz. The burial will be made in Woodlawn Cemetery, Milroy, beside his wife whose

maiden name was Miss Sophia Ramsey of Milroy. The body may be viewed in the Milroy church, Wednesday afternoon, 2 o'clock, and until the time of the services. All of the relatives and friends of the deceased will meet at the home of Mrs. B. Albert Baker, Milroy, Wednesday, 2 p.m., to proceed in a body to the church. The father spent much of his time with his daughter, Mrs. Baker.

Mr. Nale went from Milroy to Altoona two weeks ago to visit his six sons, who reside in that city.

On last Sunday the day before Mr. Nale's unexpected death, he was up and around and enjoying his usual health and ate his dinner at the home of his son, Clarence Nale, Altoona, and then complained about being ill. He went to his bed and soon sank into a state of unconsciousness from which he did not rally. A stroke of paralysis caused his death and he slept peacefully away.

Funeral of Mr. Nale

The funeral services of Albert W. Nale were held Tuesday (?) afternoon in the Lutheran Church, the pastor, Rev. Charles A. Lantz officiating, assisted by the Rev. Harry Deiss, pastor of the Congregational church Both paid great tribute to the life and sterling qualities of Milroy's "Grand Old Man." The floral tributes were of great number and unusual beauty.

The body of Mr. Nale was followed to Woodlawn Cemetery by a large number of sorrowing relatives and friends where the services were conducted by Revs. Lantz and Deiss. The carriers were six members of the Milroy Lodge of Odd Fellows, W. O. Rearick, C. G. Miller, J. Edward Bobb, Faye Cunningham, Charles Aurand and James Pennepacker.

A representation of Captain McClenahan Post No. 287 American Legion, was present and the body of comrade Nale was lowered to its last resting place to the notes of the bugle sounding taps.

Sophia's obituaries follow:

From the *Lewistown Sentinel* of November 12, 1917:

Mrs. Albert W. Nale died last evening nine o'clock, at her home, Milroy, aged 70 years, 9 months and 23 days. Rheumatism and stomach trouble were the cause of her death. Her maiden name was Sophia Ramsey and she is survived by her husband, Albert W. Nale, Jury Commissioner elect, and nine sons and a daughter and a sister and a brother. One son is dead. The funeral services will be held in the Milroy Lutheran church, Rev. R. L. Lubold officiating. Interment will be made in Woodlawn Cemetery.

From the *Lewistown Sentinel* of November 14, 1917:

Mrs. Sophia Catherine Nale, wife of A.W. Nale of Milroy died Sunday evening about nine o'clock after being seriously ill but a short time. Mrs. Nale's name was Ramsey, being a daughter of Perry and Amelia Ramsey and was born in the east end of the valley on Jan. 18, 1846.

Mrs. Nale has been a patient sufferer from rheumatism for many years and was confined to a chair most of the time. She was well-known to every body in the valley and was loved and esteemed by all her friends and neighbors. She was united in marriage to Albert W. Nale Dec. 4th, 1867, shortly after Mr. Nale returned from the army, and to this union eleven children were born, nine of whom, with the husband, survive as follows:

William, of Akron, Ohio; Brown, of Clearfield, Pa.; Mrs. Bert (Minnie) Baker of Milroy; Jesse, Perry, John, Clarence, Harry and Frank, all, living in Altoona. One girl and one boy preceded their mother to the grave a number of years ago. One sister, Mrs. John (Maggie) Armstrong, of Milroy, and one brother, William Ramsey of Siglerville, also survive.

Funeral Services were conducted in the Lutheran Church, Milroy, this afternoon at two o'clock by Rev. R. L. Lubold. Interment at Woodlawn.

Rothrock Dairy

J.T. Rothrock and Rothrock Dairy were the same operation. The milk was bought, pasteurized, bottled, and sold from the Junction location. It was located in the alley, back of the third house from the Junction school, going toward the firehouse.

Joseph (? - John) T. Rothrock was the owner and was assisted by his son, Albert Faye Rothrock. The dairy was destroyed during the 1936 flood. They continued in business for a short time after the flood by buying milk from Grant Arnold. Then they closed for good. Information from William (Dixie) Spangler.

Ella's marriage to John T. Rothrock is recorded in *Commemorative Biographical Encyclopedia of the Juniata Valley, Comprising the Counties of Huntingdon, Mifflin, Juniata and Perry, Pennsylvania*; J.M. Runk & Co., Chambersburg, 1897, Page 739. The names and birth dates of the children are recorded there. It is also noted on page 596 - her name there is listed as Ellen. This is in a biographical sketch of Samuel Henry Rothrock, M.D., a brother of John T. Rothrock.

The 1860 Census lists an Eliza, aged 1, as a daughter of Wm. & Sara Nale. She is listed following John Reed Nale whose age is noted as 3. In the 1870 Census, the name is Ellie, age 12, two years younger than John R. Nale. I am assuming that a mistake was made in the name in the 1860 census and that the reference is to Ella. John R. Nale died in September of 1936 and the ages given for John and Ella indicate that John was a little more than two years older.

Ella and John R. Nale are listed as working in the household of William Ehrenfield and his wife Mary (Alexander), farmers in the 1880 census.

From the *Lewistown Sentinel* of Monday, Feb. 3, 1936:

Mrs. Ella B. Rothrock, widow of John Thomas Rothrock, died Sunday afternoon at 4:30 at the E. W. Black Hospital where she had been a patient for five weeks. Death was due to a stroke. Her health had been failing for over a year. Her residence was at 30 Duquesne Way.

Clarence R. Nale died unexpectedly of a heart seizure at his home at Reedsville at 7:30 o'clock Monday morning.

Mr. Nale was born in Armaugh Township May 23, 1894, a son of the late Charles L. and Anna Jane McClintic Nale.

He is survived by his wife, the former Anna F. Bodtorf of Harrisburg, two sons Clarence B. Nale of Milroy and Charles L. Nale of Lake Shore, Md., four daughters Mrs. Earl (Louise) May of Pleasant Gap, Mrs. Eugene (Hazel) Madden of Rockhill Furnace, Mrs. Carl (Francis) Krick of McClure RD and Mtrs. Raymond (Mary) Hawk of Hockenduaqua, Lehigh County, and 19 grandchildren.

Mr. Nale was a crane operator at the Standard Steel 47 years, retired in 1959.;

He was a member of the Loyal Order of Moose and the United Steel Workers of America Local 1940.

Services will be held in the Bohn Funeral Home at Reedsville Thursday morning.

Clarence R.'s gravestone is also at Woodlawn with the dates 1894-1964. His wife is listed as Anna Bodtorf and their children are listed as: Louise E., Clarence B., Charles L, Hazel M. Frances N. and Mary M.

Louise Elaine was born October 29, 1927, Clarence Bodtorf on Dec. 16, 1928, Charles Lee on August 15, 1930, Hazel Marie on July 11, 1932, Francis Naomi on Jan. 1, 1934, and Mary McClintic on Dec. 3, 1939.

Anna's son, Charles Lee, recalls that she was the teacher at a one-room schoolhouse in Siglerville. The school house still stands and is now a convenience store.

Charles Lee Nale now resides in New Jersey. he is married to Phyllis Geraldine and they have six children: Charles Lee, Jr; Charlis Leedine, Joel Vantine, Dan Davin, Mark Noel and Kim Lynette
His son Dan Davin is married to Sylvia Howle.

The following information about the family was also provided by C.L. Nale, Sr.:

My Grandfather was known as Jack Nale around the Siglerville, PA area. I don't believe that I ever saw a photograph of Charles Lunger Nale. My father used to say that he had a handlebar mustache. I believe that he started a Drum & Bugle band in the Siglerville area which survived him by many years. He worked in the Stone Quarry in Naginy, which was only a few miles from Siglerville. A few years prior to his demise, he was involved in an accident at the Quarry. I believe that he was coupling, or uncoupling a moving stone car when he slipped and was caught between two cars. This accident left him in a wheel chair for the balance of his life which was about 3 or 4 years. My father, Clarence Rush Nale, also worked at the same Quarry when he was a young man of 19 or 20. I have a picture of him which was taken at the Quarry. My father owned the first automobile in Siglerville, PA., a Model T ford. Later that year, about 1915, the 2nd car was purchased by another resident of Siglerville, not a relative of ours. I will check this out with other family members, but I remember my father speaking of my grandfather operating a barbershop in the front room of his home, and at one time had an ice cream parlor there. I found it strange that he (William H. Nale) died of carbuncles on his neck for this reason. When I was a boy of 9 or 10 my father developed carbuncles on the back of his neck. Many people were very concerned that he might die of this malady. The carbuncles (which look like very large boils) had to be lanced & drained each day. He did survive that problem, and was left with multiple scars on his neck. Before I heard the story of Wm. H. Nale having died because of carbuncles, I would have guessed a farm related accident, or heart disease, which seems to be prevalent in the Nale males. My father had his 1st heart attack when he was 50 years old. He had another major heart attack when he was about 58 years of age, and finally succumbed to a 3rd heart attack at the age of 70. He continued to work, operating a crane, in the open hearth mill of Standard Steel Company until he was 65 years of age.

The Siglerville Band

Charles Lunger Nale was one of the organizers of the Siglerville Band when it was started in January, 1892. The band played all over the area at picnics, holiday celebrations etc. until its last concert on Aug. 13, 1965. The first band was made up of 14 members and included E.B. Nale, H. L. Nale and C.L. Nale. Many other Nales participated in the years that followed. At the 100th anniversary gathering of former band members and friends, Clarence B. Nale talked about and presented a ledger that was kept by his grandfather from the very beginning of the band's organization. The ledger and much more information about the band is now kept at the Mifflin County Historical Society. A photo of the band in 1942 appears later in the photo section of this study.

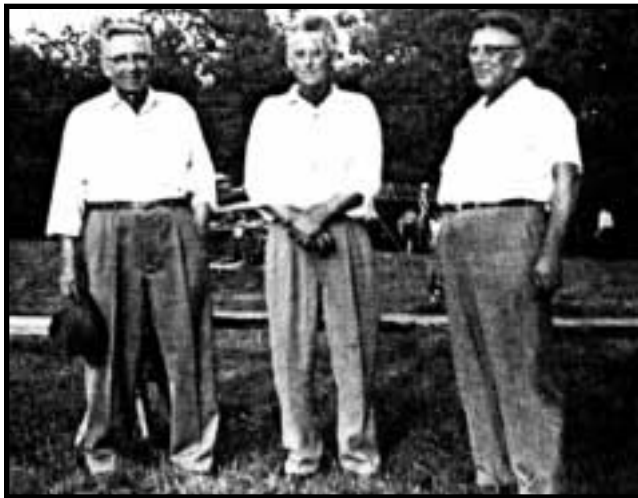
